National Charity NWG Network asks all to unite against child exploitation for their 10<sup>th</sup> National Child Exploitation Awareness Raising Day – 18th March.

The National Child Exploitation Awareness Raising Day aims to highlight the issues surrounding child exploitation: encouraging everyone to **think**, **spot and speak out** against abuse and adopt a zero-tolerance attitude to child exploitation.

Previous National Child Exploitation Awareness Raising Days have seen hundreds of events take place across the UK, ranging from poster and leaflet displays to whole authorities embarking on targeted campaigns across public services and shopping centres.

Working with over 14,800 professionals across the UK to help prevent and raise awareness of child exploitation, NWG Network continues to leverage the strength of that network to tackle the problem head-on.

"Each year we use our campaign to raise awareness of child exploitation and encourage everyone in our society to tackle the issues of the exploitation of our children.

## Notes to Editors:

- NWG Network is a child exploitation (CE) network strategically and operationally supporting voluntary/statutory agencies tackling child exploitation, with links across Europe, Southeast Asia, Africa, Canada and the USA.
- The NWG Network has worked with or is currently working across the UK with practitioners from Local Safeguarding Children's Partnerships (LSCPs), Police Forces, Health, Community Safety Partnerships, and Voluntary and Private sector organisations.
- NWG Network holds approximately 100 events annually that bring a range of organisations together to continually improve how we tackle CE in the UK and worldwide.
- The NWG Network in the UK spans over 230 organisations with 14,800 + points of contact to disseminate information on the issue of child exploitation.
- Our reach and national oversight allow us to address the issues surrounding CE, Trafficking and Modern Slavery from the Central Government level through to grassroots workers and volunteers.

### **Key Stats**

- In 2022 7,019 children were referred to the National Referral Mechanism (NRM) having been identified as potential victims of Modern Slavery (including Child Sexual Exploitation, Child Criminal Exploitation and Trafficking)\* Modern Slavery: NRM statistics UK of year summary 2022
- In 2021, there were over 850 arrests across the UK for accessing child sexual abuse material every single month (CSA Centre)
- In the year ending March 2021, police recorded modern slavery offences involving a child increased by 27% to 3,239, continuing the upward trend seen in recent years.
- The most common reason for children to be trafficked in the UK is for criminal exploitation (NRM End of Year Summary 2022)
